We recorded 12 wins and 10 losses. In total, we scored 94 goals, averaging 4 goals a game and conceded 70 to give us a goal difference of +24.

Throughout the season, we saw the boys improve massively. In particular, the way they moved the ball up the pitch as a team and understanding how and where they needed to be, to support their team mates. For the most part their attitude and commitment to each other was exceptional and they are fast becoming a strong unit, which balances the desire to win, whilst also approaching the game in the right way.

We welcomed 2 new additions to the squad in Brook Sellars and Luca Desaraju. Both left footed, they made brilliant additions to the squad and grew in confidence as the season went on. We also, saw Zach Goldthorpe decide to take on the position of goalkeeper. His strong technical ability as an outfield footballer, helped us build attacks from the back but his improvement in goal was also noticed throughout the season as well.

There were many highlights that I could mention but the 3 games that stick in my memory due to the performance of the boys was the 1-0 victory against Leeds Juniors Ajax, the 2-1 win against Wakefield AFC and the 3-2 victory against Shadwell United. This is where we saw the boys work best

as a team and produced close wins against arguably the 3 strongest teams in our league.

Another really good season for the U11 Colts. We got off to an unlucky start with a narrow loss up on the hill at LS27 FC in a game we were close to winning, before then getting back to winning ways for our next couple of games.

The start of the season was mostly about getting the boys used to the new positions and new team shapes needed for 9-a-side football.

At times we came unstuck against quality opposition while everyone was learning their new roles, such as a big loss against Ebor Gardens in October where their academy players were able to exploit gaps between our midfield and defence. We learnt some important lessons from those games as a team, and as the season has progressed, we've improved our shape and become stronger defensively.

I've always believed that the job of a coach at this age is not to create a team that are amazing at under 11, but to develop the players and give them the foundational skills now, so they can be fantastic players as teenagers and older. One of the ways we've been doing that in the last couple of seasons is rotating the positions around. That can sometimes be frustrating for the players, but the skills they learn by playing in every position across the season will make them better in the long term. We've started to see as we progressed through the season that they're naturally settling on certain positions while still having the skills to fill in and provide cover across the park.

The other area that took time to bed in, was to play it out from the back and avoid long balls up field. It takes time, and we saw some errors costing us goals early in the season, but the players are now developing more confidence on the ball in those areas and will be better players because of it.

We finished the season with some fantastic goalscoring,

including long range thunderbolts, well placed free kicks, finishes from tight angles, 1-on-1s, tap-ins and even direct from a corner, taking our goal difference to +22.

From 27 matches played, we finished with 13 wins, 12 losses and 2 draws, ready to keep on developing and improving in a new season from September. Go Colts!

A very long, enjoyable and successful season that started in Rothwell with a Gala win in September 2023, ended in Rothwell with a last league game win in May 2024.
